This is the second installment of the high school music trilogy. High School Musical 2 follows Zack Bolton (Zac Efron), Gabriella Montes (Vanessa Hudgens) and the rest of the East High Wildcats as they go on summer vacation. Troy, a job-hunting to fund his upcoming expedition to college, manages to get a job for him and his friends at a country club owned by Sharpay Evans (Ashley Tisdale). Unbeknownst to Troy and the team, Sharpay seeks to sabotage their friendship as well as the romance between Troy and Gabriella, and pursues a relationship with him instead. High School Musical 2 retained Utah as the centerpiece of the filming with a return to Eastern School, while Entrada's Snow Canyon Country Club was accepted as Evans' country club. Additional scenes were filmed in Los Angeles. After the release of the film on August 17, 2007, it broke many viewing records as it became the most commercially successful Disney Channel Original Movie (DCOM) ever created. In the U.S., High School Musical 2 generated 17 million viewers in the premiere broadcast, breaking its predecessor's record by more than ten million, while that figure remains the highest on the network's history. It also took the top spot in the ranking of major cable TV shows at the time. The soundtrack to the film was also widely available; it was certified double platinum in its first week as it debuted at number one in the United States. In addition, its lead single, "What Time Is It?", reached number six on the Billboard Hot 100. The film and soundtrack received generally mixed reviews from critics, while the reception of fans was more positive. The sequel, High School Musical 3: Senior Year, was released theatrically in 2008. The school year phase ends all at Eastern High School looking forward to the summer holidays (What time is it?). Troy Bolton is still dating Gabriella Montes, who decides to stay in Albuquerque with her mother. Troy eventually decides to look for a summer job to get money for college. Sharpay and Ryan Evans plan to spend the summer at the Family Club Lava Springs but in the summer, Sharpay plans to include the harassment of Troy, whom she arranged to be hired at the club. However, Troy convinces the club's manager, Mr. Fulton, to hire Gabriella and their close group of friends as well, including Taylor and Chad. Sharpay is furious to learn that Gabriella works as one of the rescuers but can't get her fired, so she orders Fulton to give them the difficult task so they want to quit. Fulton tries to intimidate the group, but Troy restores their trust and convinces them that they can continue (Working it out). Troy continues to worry about college funding. Sharpay feels his need and arranges Troy to be promoted to the University of Albuquerque Senior Basketball Team, hoping it will convince him to sing with her on the talent show. Meanwhile, Kelsey writes a song for Troy and Gabriella Anse, agreeing to sing with her friends on the show (You Are The Music In Me), not knowing that Sharpay is vying for his attention. In the extended version, Sharpay and Ryan trap Troy as he prepares to date Gabriella by performing his own song (Humuhumunukunukuapua'a), to Troy's great annoyance. Ryan realizes he doesn't mean much to Sharpay anymore as she's ready to blow her brother aside for the chance to perform with Troy. This leads to tension between the siblings, and Ryan angrily informs Sharpay that he will no longer obey her orders. Taylor and Gabriella invite Ryan to a baseball game, where he persuades the Wildcats to take part in a talent show (I don't dance). Troy and Gabriella's relationship is strained when Troy sees Ryan with Gabriella, causing jealousy. Because of Troy's promise, he and Sharpay are rehearsing another song for the talent show (You Are The Music In Me (Sharpay Version)). Troy also gets into a heated argument with Chad for abandoning his friends, because of his perceived selfishness after being promoted by Sharpay. When Sharpay discovers that Ryan and the Wildcats are collecting their own performance on the show, she orders Mr. Fulton to ban all employees from performing. Gabriella confronts Sharpay about her intervention and quits her job in Lava Springs. Troy eavesdrops on the exchange and tries to convince Gabriella to change her mind. Gabriella expresses a loss of trust with Troy (Gotta Go My Own Way), leaves Lava Springs and returns to him his necklace, which he gave her after graduation. Troy returns to work the next day to discover that his friends refuse to talk to them, after his previous dispute with Chad. Kelsey silently shows Troy a notice from Mr. Fulton, forcing Troy to doubt his own motives (Bet On It) and confronts Sharpay, telling her that he will not sing with her. He then reconciles with Chad and apologizes to the Wildcats for his absence. They convince him to sing in a talent show, which he does only on the condition that they can all perform as well. According to Sharpay's alleged instructions, Ryan Troy is a new song to learn the moments before the show. When Troy takes the stage, he asks Sharpay why she switched the song, and Sharpay is shocked to discover that her brother has cheated on her. Troy sings the song (Everyday) alone while Gabriella and the Wildcats join him on stage. After all, Sharpay proudly presents his brother Ryan with the talent show award. After the talent show, all Wildcats go to the golf course to enjoy the fireworks. Everyone celebrates the end of summer with a pool party (All for One), which features a cameo appearance by Miley Cyrus. Starring Main Article: The list of school musical characters Troy Bolton (Zac Efron) is the boyfriend of Gabriella, the most popular male student in Eastern High School and captain of the university basketball team. For this film, Efron did all his own singing, while in the first high school musical, his singing was mixed with the voice of singer Drew Seeley. Gabriella Montes (Vanessa Hudgens) is a friend of Troy's who is glad she will still be visiting East High. She was a lifeguard at Lava Springs Country Club before Sharpay's action forced her to quit and part with Troy. Ryan Evans (Lucas Grable) is a twin brother of Sharpay who lives in the shadow of his prima donna sister. Sharpay Evans (Ashley Tisdale) is Ryan's prima donna twin sister determined to win a talent show, and is vying for Troy's attention and doing everything to help him. Chad Danforth (Corbin Blue) is Troy's best friend and very good friends with Jason and Sick. Taylor McKessie (Merrick Coleman) - Gabriella's best friend. She is also friends with Kelsey Nielsen and Martha Cox and is dating Chad. She is the captain of the School Team Scholastic Decathlon. She has a summer job in Lava Springs as an event coordinator. Thomas Fulton (Mark L. Taylor) is the manager of Lava Springs. Coach Jack Bolton (Bart Johnson) is Troy's father and East High basketball coach. Darby Evans (Jessica Tuck) is Sharpay and Ryan's mother and president of the Lava Springs Council. Vance Evans (Robert Curtis Brown) as Sharpay and Ryan's father. Ms. Darbus (Ison Reed) is a stern drama teacher in East High. The Baylor (Chris Warren Jr.) is friends with Troy and Chad and plays for the basketball team. Jason Cross (Ryan Sanborn) is friends with Troy, Chad, and zinc and plays on the basketball team. Kelsey Nielsen (Olesya Rulin) is friends with Gabriella and Taylor, a pianist and composer. Martha Cox (Casey Straw) is friends with Gabriella, Kelsey and Taylor. Jackie (Tanya Chisholm) is one of Sharpay's friends (a.g. Sharpett). Lucille Bolton (Leslie Wing Pomeroy) is Troy's mother. Lea (Kelly Baker) is another Sharpette. Emma (McCall Clark) is another Sharpett. Unknown Wildcats player (Shane Harper) is the main dancer. The girl in the pool (Miley Cyrus) is an unknown dancer at the end (cameo). The Release of High School Musical 2 aired at 8 p.m. ET on 17 2007 and included a television show organized by Ortega and the cast of the film. On Saturday, August 18, Disney Channel showed High School Musical 2: Wildcat Chat, in which the stars of the film answered questions from fans. On August 19, Disney aired a singing version of the film together. On May 23, DirecTV announced that they will be holding an exclusive high-definition airing of the film just days after premiering on August 17 on its network-only channel, The 101. The Disney Channel aired a weekly program called Road to High School Musical 2, starting June 8, 2007 and the preceding premiere of High School Musical 2 in August. The show offered viewers a behind-the-scenes look at the film's production. The world premiere of the first issue of What Time Is It took place on Radio Disney on May 25, 2007, and similarly You Are The Music In Me took place on July 13, 2007. On December 11, 2007, the film was released on DVD and Blu-ray under the name High School Musical 2: Extended Edition. On September 15, 2008, a two-disc special edition of the film was released under the name High School Musical 2: Deluxe Dance Edition. The first broadcast of the film on August 17, 2007 broke records, gaining 17.2 million viewers. That number made it, at the time, the most popular major cable tv show in history (the previous record was held by ESPN's Monday Night Football between the New York Giants and Dallas Cowboys on October 23, 2006, which attracted 16 million viewers), the most popular cable movie ever (the previous record was held by TNT on January 21, 2001, which brought in 12.5 million viewers) and the largest audience of any program on the air or cable in the 2007 summer television season, along with Friday nights for five years. Ratings for the second screening of the film fell to 8.4 million, and the third screening fell to 7.4 million, bringing the weekend's premiere total to 33.04 million viewers. In Latin America, the premiere of High School Musical 2 was seen by 3.3 million viewers in the northern region. The film was the most popular in its schedule, among all cable channels, and produced the highest rating channel, surpassing all original Disney Channel movies. Among other entries, the premiere in Argentina surpassed the debut of High School Musical last year, at 107 percent, while in Brazil the sequel reached 208 percent, and Mexico did so with 61 percent. In the UK, the film became Disney Channel UK's most watched program, with a total of 1.2 million viewers in the first screening. The film received mixed positive reviews from critics, receiving 57% of the points on Rotten Tomatoes, receiving a score of 72/100 on Metacritic. U.S. Robert Bianco awarded the film three stars out of four, stating that High School Musical 2 was sweet, smart, filled with talent and energy and awash with innocence. While critics enjoyed the film, they noted that the film's premiere time seemed strange, premiering only when the school was about to start again, while the film's plot involved a gang going on summer vacation. High School Musical 2 won the So Hot Right Now award at the Nickelodeon Australian Kids' Choice Awards 2007, which featured music actor from high school, Zac Efron. High School Musical 2: On Stage! Through Musical Theatre International, Disney Theatrical began licensing theatrical rights in October 2008. The MTI initially recruited seven schools to serve as tests for a new full-length device, but due to more complexities with multiple projects and script and bills, all at the expense of two schools were forced to drop out of the pilot program. On May 18, 2008, Woodlands High School became the first school to produce a high school musical 2. From July 17 to August 3, 2008, Harrell Theater, in Collierville, Tennessee, was the first community theater to perform a production that featured both a senior cast and a junior cast. From January 15 to February 15, 2009, the premiere of the production on the West Coast was presented by the School of Dramatic Art of the Pacific Repertory Theatre. The production was directed by PacRep founder Stephen Murr, who previously directed the Californian premiere of the first high school musical.
